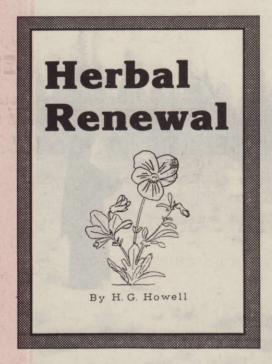

### Jerry Jampolsky coming to Kelowna "Healing your Relationships"

Dr. Jerry Jampolsky and Diane Cirincione will be making their first visit to the Okanagan. They have travelled worldwide to lecture and counsel in response to the growing awareness that attitudinal healing can constructively affect every aspect of our lives. They lecture on a variety of subjects, such as: healing relationships, attitudinal healing, shifting perceptions about life and living, death and dying, The transformation process in education, business, medicine, politics and in our individual lives. Attitudinal healing can be defined as a shift in perception that removes blocks to the awareness of love's presence, thereby releasing all of our negative thoughts such as guilt, pain, and condemning judgments.

Emphasis is placed on the power and responsibility of personal choice where one actually can choose peace instead of conflict, love instead of fear, joy instead of guilt, They stress that we all have the capability to be love-finders rather than fault-finders; to be love givers rather than love-seekers; to realize that giving and receiving are the same, and to teach only love for that is what we are. A significant aspect of their work involves interacting globally with others who have the shared vision of hope for a peaceful and healed planet.

Their message is a simple one... There are no problems that cannot be solved with love and forgiveness.

Jerry Jampolsky, M.D., psychiatrist, has gained international recognition for his work with children who have catastrophic illness. In 1975 he established The Center for Attitudinal Healing in Tiburon, California, where children and adults with life threatening illness may find peace of mind that is transforming for them and their families.

Diane and Jerry co-founded the AIDS Hotline for Kids and were co-directors of the international project Children as Teachers of Peace (a non-profit organization based on furthering international relations and friendship between children of different countries). Together Jerry and Diane have co-authored many books and narrated many audio tapes. They will be in Kelowna sponsored by the Interior Course in Miracles Association and CHBC Television, October 11, Thursday night.

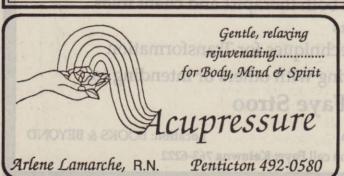
# SALMON ARM, B.C. Chosen as site for CANADIAN BRANCH of the WORLD PEACE UNIVERSITY

This fall exciting things will be happening in Salmon Arm, B.C., to further the cause of world peace and a saner, safer environment. Salmon Arm has been chosen as the Canadian site for the World Peace University in Canada. Based at The Center in Gleneden, The World Peace University Society Canadian Branch, will provide an education to help people achieve a world of peace.

The goals of the University are to educate people who desire to co-create a world where peace is a way of life, where environment balance exists, where there is food sufficiency, where social justice prevails, and where an individual achieves the highest degree of self-realization within a spirit of co-operation.

The World Peace University is affiliated with the United Nations through an agreement of co-operation. The headquarters and principal campus is in Eugene, Oregon. Other branches are already established in Chile and Bangladesh and are being planned in Spain and New Zealand. The U.N. University for Peace in Costa Rica is now operating the Radio for Peace International as a joint project with the World Peace University. The Board of Directors and International Board of Advisors are composed of world-renowned figures who are concerned about world peace. Amoung them are Dr. Robert Carazo, former President of Costa Rica and founder of the University for Peace, and Dr. Michael Cohen, founder of the Audubon Expedition Institute.

The main headquarters of the Canadian Branch of the World Peace University will be situated at The Center in Gleneden, Salmon Arm, British Columbia. Andy Schneider, founder of the Center, has been elected Rector of the University, with Dorothy Argent as Chairperson. Andy is currently Director of Other Dimensions Services. His academic studies through nine years of University training led to degrees in Psychology, Philosophy, Theology and Education. The Canadian Branch of the World Peace University will be offering courses in Peace Studies, Ecology, Personal Development and Esoteric Studies and Global and Holistic Health Studies.



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### Personal Rainbow - the AURA

As interest in personal growth and spirituality increase, so does the focus upon the human aura; that surrounding rainbow of colour which is the energies of our physical, emotional, mental and spiritual selves.

Our aura is at once our greatest asset, and our greatest challenge. Through awareness of the energies/qualities present in our aura, we can strengthen our bond with the supreme source of life; through denial of our essence, we can also allow the illusion of separation to create pain and confusion.

The presence of the aura has been recognized for a very long time; it is the halo surrounding the saints in paintings and stained glass. Sensitive people often see the aura quite easily; almost everyone can see it with a simple training taking 4-5 hours.

That energy is colour, and vice versa, is quickly becoming accepted as fact, and certainly feedback from my many clients has convinced me that colour is an accurate indicator of energy. Yellow in the aura does indeed indicate a clear active mind, blue denotes loving wisdom, red, will power and determination, etc.

There are three distinct auras in our auric field. the physical/etheric,

emotional/astral, and mental. The physical/etheric or "health: aura is a silvery haze extending one or two inches from our physical bodies. This aura uses instinct and all our five senses for physical discrimination of our environment, and acts out our emotions and thoughts. A Russian couple, the Kirlians, have developed a camera which photographs this aura. The emotional/astral aura extends 2-3 feet beyond the etheric aura. It has a background colour representing our basic approach to life, other colours of emotional strengths or areas needing work, and over this a wash of colours representing our emotions of the moment. This aura creates a flow of desires, based on memory, which attract to us the situations we need in order to learn through experiencing and relationships; an essential step in personal and spiritual evolution. The mental aura extends beyond the emotional/astral. It has colours denoting various energies or qualities and symbols representing thoughts. The function of this aura, or "mental body", is to balance our physical, emotional and mental selves creating a synthesis of physical action, emotional reaction, and mental evaluation and discrimination, under the direction of our higher selves, or soul.

While every living thing has an etheric aura, it is only us, as self conscious beings, who have an emotional and mental aura. The aura of the soul is also present, but it too light or faint to be seen by most.

The states of our health, our strengths and weaknesses, our balance of lack thereof, in fact any infomation about innermost being is present in our auras, as they are indeed the energies of our selves, our "personal rainbows".

A note of caution: although many people can see the aura much training is needed to clearly and accurately interpret what is being viewed. "Being read" by someone without training can (and has) led to needless trauma and pain. And as with all information, accept what rings true, discard the rest. We truly are our own best guides!

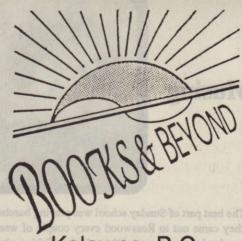
Come on folks, attend workshops, read Adbusters, support Greenpeace, there are alternatives. And only you can make it happen.

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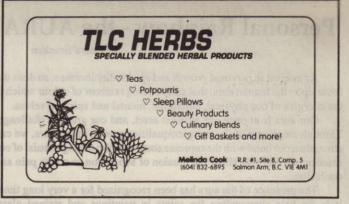
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# THE WONDERFUL WORLD OF HERBS

### **OUR FOOD CHOICES**

By changing our eating habits, claims author John Robbins, we can help save our planet.

John Robbin's story is one of mythic proportions: Heir to Ice Cream Empire Takes On the Great American Food Machine. Groomed from childhood to succeed his father as head of Baskin-Robbins, he declined the family fortune at age 20, because, as he says quite simply, 'my heart wasn't in it' A lengthy personal and spiritual odyssey followed, including years of meditation, numerous trips to India, and stints as a yoga teacher, growth center founder and workshop leader. Now, more than two decades later, he has written a book that shakes the animal foods industry to its very foundations.

Diet for a New America (Stillpoint 1987), is an eloquent, meticulously documented indictment of the meat, poultry, and dairy industries - so eloquent, in fact that it was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in nonfiction.

Robbins, stopped eating meat shortly after leaving home, but it was not till his yoga instructor suggested that he give up dairy products and become a pure vegetarian that he began giving serious ramifications of eating animal products. In writing Diet for a New America he found a wealth a evidence suggesting that the eating habits that support human health have social and environmental benefits too.

Robbins is founder and president of EarthSave Foundation, an organization devoted to letting people know how "human health, well-being, and survival are inextricably woven with the fate of all forms of life on Earth".

John Robbins will be in Kelowna, Tuesday, September 4. Organized by the CHIP Alumini and Dr. Hans Diehl. His topic will be issues of diet, nutrition, health and ecology. This is the first time Robbins has been sponsored in the Okanagan and is considered a powerful spokesman in the country for a sane, ethical and sustainable future. He has received a standing ovation at the United Nations, and has been the recipient of countless awards, including the National Alliance for Animal Legislation's "Humanitarian of the Year" award. He has appeared on such national television shows as Geraldo Rivera and The Donahue Show. His work had been called amoung the most important events of the century by many of the nation's leading authorities on alternatives in health and ecology.

Dr. Hans Diehl is a health science specialist and directs the Lifestyle Medicine Institute in Loma Linda, California and journeys to the Okanagan to conduct a Heartscreen Project. 2500 participants in Kelowna are participating in Diehl's program to normalize their health and receive and evaluation of their progress. The Coronary Health Improvement Project is very beneficial in identifying peoples risk of heart disease and demonstrates that most diabetics, hypertensives and heart patients can normalize their disease and become drug-free again within weeks by simplifying their customary lethal North American diet!

The great illusion of our personality life is our sense of being at the centre of the universe. ### Just what is it Astrologers do, anyway?

An astrologer calculates the positions of the planets at the exact moment an individual is born. This natal chart or horoscope usually looks like a circle. This is the mathematical or scientific part of the astrologer's work. The chart is correct astronomically; the planets really WERE in those positions when the client was born.

The next step takes astrologer and client from the "mathematical" into the "meaning" world. From ancient times, astrologers have noticed that each planet represents particular character traits. This is what is meant when we say the astrologer "interprets" your chart the various positions of each planet are studied and the meanings derived and combined until they describe a whole person - you. This process is also called "synthesis" because the astrologer must take the potential meanings of each planet and weigh them with all the other potentials indicated by the complete chart. No single factor can be interpreted on its own - a human being is much too complex. No competent astrologer would risk his/her art by so simplistic an approach.

To give you an example, an astrologer might find the planet Uranus occupying a powerful position in the chart. Uranus symbolizes a strong need for individual freedom, and a tendency to want to feel very unique, quite different from anyone else. Sometimes it indicates a person who is merely their own person, but it can also indicate the possibility that the individual is rebellious, perhaps to the point of irresponsibility and outright destructiveness. The Uranus person is also usually somewhat aloof, and may strike others as cold and unfeeling. Now, if Uranus were the only prominent planet then it would be indicative of a major tendency in the personality, but usually there are complicating and conflicting factors elsewhere in the horoscope.

In the above example, the client's chart might also show a large number of planets in the sign Cancer, a sign which is associated with a strong bond to mother and nurturing in general, rapport with children and great respect for the home, the family and the larger family of clan or nation. Cancer people have very strong feelings and may be unpredictably moody; warm and comforting one moment and withdrawn and seemingly unresponsive the next.

So which one describes the client? Well, both. People really are endlessly complex. This particular person will have times when s/ he feels strong emotions and really wants to be in a close, warm, very emotionally nurturing relationship with someone. At other times s/he will feel very independent, more into thoughts than feelings, and won't want anyone around making demands or expecting anything. Having their chart interpreted can do such a person a world of good, because other people in their life will often have been bewildered and angered by the client's switches back and forth, and may have accused them of being unreliable, or of making false promises, and so on. Such a client frequently has developed some uncertainty as to their own sanity. The astrologer can point out that such switches are normal for this individual, and so foster self-acceptance.

Beyond describing personality, what else can an astrologer do? That, like the quality of the interpretation, depends on the astrologer's background and training. Some consider their job done once they have interpreted the chart. This is a perfectly legitimate decision, to place their limit at this point. Such astrologers will keep a list of other helping professionals, such as psychologists and various types of lay counselors, handy so they can refer their clients to these people. For example, the above client may well be relieved to hear that his/her personality switches are normal, but that will not substantially ease relationships with others, who tend to prefer consistency! It might be desirable to refer this client to a counsellor who can offer insights into how to consciously direct those different moods into the appropriate situations.

In other words, the client can learn to stay in the Cancer warmth and nurturance while with his/her children because they require that. S/he can learn to switch into Uranian independence and focus on rational thought at work, if the job requires this, or to pursue a hobby in which s/he can be rational and inventive and not have to answer to anyone else. S/he can also learn to inform the spouse of which is predominant, so that they can have a better idea of what expect. Spouses greatly appreciate knowing when a mate is approachable and when it is safer to back away and let some air into the relationship.

Some astrologers offer counselling services as a follow-up. Competence levels do vary, however so it is a good idea to find out where the astrologer took their training.

There are few schools for astrologers, but if the person you call has attended classes, workshops or conventions, taken correspondence course, or was a member of a study group for at least a year you have some indications that they tried to get what training they could. Astrologers who also offer counselling services should certainly be able to tell you what workshops and/or courses they attended.

A last issue to ask is the astrologer's own belief system. Some specialize in predications, and believe in fate.

If you want to understand yourself better, to learn about how unconscious needs sometimes drive you to do things you don't understand, learn to identify and heal inner conflicts which have produced miserable life situations, or find out how to take charge of your life and your many wonderful selves, find an astrologer who has a background in psychology and counselling skills and who believes in free will, selfdevelopment and right of every individual to be the best s/he can be. You'll be happier!

A last point: to calculate your chart, an astrologer needs to know your birthdate, place of birth and the time of your birth, to the minute. If you don't know your birthtime find an astrologer who can "rectify" a chart. S/he will ask for an extensive list of events and month and year they occurred, and with this, she will research until she confirms your birthtime. Then you, too can join the ranks of those who have enjoyed, benefitted and grown from their chart interpretation!

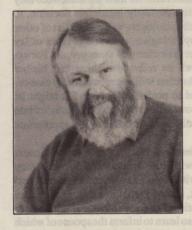

# for Change

### NOVEMBER 18TH, 1990 MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

Municipal elections in British Columbia are now organized to occur at the same time in all municipal jurisdictions. They are happening in November of 1990.

Maybe it's time you considered supporting somebody for municipal council or considered running for council yourself.

### **ACTING LOCALLY**

The popular slogan of the green movement worldwide is "think globally, act locally". After we've done our best in the home to reduce our consumption, re-use materials whenever possible and have trained ourselves in the habits of recycling we may look around the neighbourhood and the town to see how we may advance care of the earth and it's systems, cut pollution, and preserve the essential values of good air, water and soil.

Behavior in our settlement areas is governed at the local level. Things like sewerage, sidewalks, streetlights, garbage disposal, waterworks, parks maintenance, building codes, licenses to do business. paying for schools, police, fire-protection and a host of areas affecting our day to day existences are consigned to village councils, school boards, district municipalities, cities and regional districts.

### LOCAL BUREAUCRATS STEER

So complex is the management of municipal government that it has fallen to trained bureaucrats in planning, engineering and accounting. In theory these bureaucrats take their directions from an elected body like a City Council or a Regional District Board, members of which know less about how the municipality functions from day to day than any one of their paid officials.

The agenda for the setting of public policy at the municipal level is largely in the hands of municipal officials with elected members of council essentially "rubber stamping" much of what goes down until public attention is drawn to one item or another and some sort of reaction spurs the elected officials into acting like leaders, sometimes even resorting to taking the helm to make something happen or. more commonly, to stop something from happening.

### THE GROWTH ETHIC

Municipalities are expected to grow. Municipal officials are trained and experienced in the growth and development school of

municipal management. In fact the "growth and development school" is the only one in town. A career path for a municipal official leads him to "bigger and better things"; say from being a small-town administrator to the head of the planning department for a large district municipality.

For the professional municipal manager, the bigger the budget, the more prestigious the office. This mind set is very often shared by elected officials, many of who have taken elected office because of their business acumen, the ability to "make things happen". This is not to condemn the bureaucrat, engineer or planner. We all adapt to the systam in which we must survive. In fact the accumulated knowledge and expertise of bureaucrats will be very useful when politicians direct them to investigate, plan and implement "Green" programs.

### GREEN MEANS BETTER, NOT BIGGER

In a greener world the role of local government must change. Essentially it will become a matter of "getting better, not bigger". In a "green conscious" local government it will no longer be a primary goal to attract industry to create jobs to attract a larger population to extend the tax base to provide more services to a town that's "really going places".

We now know that we are not "going places". We are one species on one planet and notions of exponential growth on the global or local level is passe. Exponential growth is a wildfire that will have to be controlled at the local and thereby at the global level.



Green politics is in need of politicians at the municipal level who will enunciate the new model for local government which includes first of all an assessment of the "carrying capacity" of the watershed not only in terms of human needs but in terms of the bio-system as a whole. The integrity of the natural systems in the settlement area will be more important than the need for more parking space in the downtown area.

In a greener municipality internal combustion engines may be banned from the downtown area. Buildings may be moved underground in some cases in order to leave room for grass and trees on the surface. Wetlands and marshes may be viewed as precious in their own right rather than things which stand in the way of "real progress".

At this juncture it must be clear what kinds of people are needed to run for office at the municipal level. We need people to run for municipal office who until now would have been considered unqualified.

Consider, however, that as many as 80% of the Canadian public say that they are willing to change their way of life to save the planet.

What are needed are women and men who can speak to such a bold undertaking, who can describe the current problem, propose solutions and gain the confidence of the public and garner support for programs that will mean alterations in accustomed ways but provide a persuasive promise of a better world. 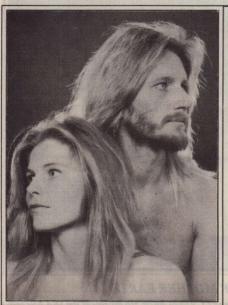

# DECREASE YOUR VEHICLE'S POLLUTION AND RESOURCE DEMAND

The fact that the automobile engine has not changed in basic design or efficiency for most of the century, would quite understandingly lead to skepticisism among many, regarding significant mileage, performance and emission improvements. However, facts of physics say there is an enormous amount of chemical energy stored in fuel, and also the average vehicle is around 10% efficient (20% is over generous).

About 10% of this huge amount of energy results in vehicle motion. In other words 90% of it is wasted, causing pollution, engine deposits and certain people realize vast profits.

To drastically increase ones mileage would require only a very slight percentage increase of efficiency.

There are two main areas of weakness in the typical engine. Some

may be aware that the average car uses about 10-15 horsepower to maintain a 60 M.P.H. speed. The rest of the engine is "just along for the ride" as it gulps fuel. The effectiveness of a simple, Canadian invented method, for example, is that one of its functions greatly reduce this fuel wasting "free ride" that can, in some vehicles, account for half of the fuel used.

The really big problem is that only vaporized fuel can burn and will be of use. In a vehicle the fuel goes into the engine as a spray of liquid droplets (about 400 - 500 microns in size) which have to turn into a vapor and then burn.

Practically all good fuel economizers in one way or another help create smaller broken up "chunks", helps them "unfreeze" better or faster, somehow delivers more individual molecules, or a combination of any or all of these things. Any method that will encourage the production of vaporized fuel will increase efficiency provided there is not too much of it. Vapor is all that can burn and it does so easily, fast and completely, and enormous amounts of fuel in the liquid form can go through the engine without even being noticed. In fact, some cars use a lot of extra fuel just because the liquid form is used to help end the relatively slow burning flame in order to prevent the burning from going on into the exhaust system.

Usually, added energy in the form of heat is often in vapor enhancing systems but not necessarily so.

Vaporization can be very effectively encouraged by magnetically polarizing and exciting the fuel molecules to help them repel one another. This is possible with a very simple installation in the gas line.

What about possible harm to the engine? Don't confuse any of this with the conventional process of making the fuel mixture lean which can cause excessive and damaging heat.

The list of benefits include quicker starts, less tune ups and maintenance problems, way less pollution, and a cleaner and longer lasting exhaust system and engine (provided you don't abuse extra power made available).

More complete burning of less fuel, causes less gunk to come out of the engine, and less to form inside the engine as engine deposits. One of the main deposits is carbon. These deposits can foul up the spark plugs and they burden the oil with abrasive particles and chemically active and corrosive substances such as acids. All promote wear and/ or breakdown encouraged by higher heat. Wear definitely causes a further decrease in efficiency and pollution such as "oil burning".

If you are rich or really don't care about saving quite a lot of money at the gas pumps' over the years, there are still at least two very important reasons to improve your vehicle's efficiency - a responsibility that for the foreseeable future will remain with the motorist.

Practically all the devices available aim at emission reduction. Oxygen reacts with the fuel vapors, in the "normal" engine where there is less vapor available and more unburnable and partly burned substances around. This leaves more oxygen to form undesirable reactions promoted by the heat present. The unburned and partly burned fuel such as carbon monoxide going out the tailpipe. Remaining oxygen then reacts with the nitrogen from the air in the engine and that causes awful brown smog.

Our fossil fuel consumption is accelerating. Reserves are running out. We are accumulating a type of personal debt effecting future generations, by consuming a far more than necessary portion of divindling non-renewable resources, as well as adding to our planets pollution burden.

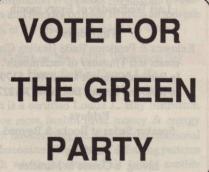
The KiKwillie Festival Society is selling memberships, a sliding scale of \$10.00 to \$25.00. We are getting lots of feedback that seems to

### What is the **Nutritional Approach** to Health?

An evaluation of a Person's Health Statistics is make by a Biological Immunity Analysis (BIA) which can be derived from urine and saliva specimens. 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### WHAT'S REALLY IN PET FOOD!

I'll bet you think the commercially prepared kibble or canned food you've been giving your cat or dog is just what the label says - " a nutritious, wholesome, well-balanced diet - all your cat or dog requires - feed this product and your pet will live to a ripe old age enjoying the best of health". WRONG !!

Commercially prepared pet foods are responsible for most of the chronic, degenerative diseases and conditions seen today by veterinarians such as arthritis, cancer, cataracts and hip dysplasia because of what they contain as well as what they omit. Even skin problems, from a simple dry, flaky condition to open oozing sores can usually be traced to the quality of the food that animal has been eating. Most veterinarians aren't aware of this, but those who are aware are often very vocal. Listen to these comments from veterinarians published recently in a west coast newspaper about the quality of pet food: "In many instances you are causing diseases in animals if you feed off-the-shelf food." .... chemical additives and preservatives in mass-produced pet foods caused skin and kidney disorders, arthritis, hyperactivity, hair loss and other problems - many of which improved by eliminating foods with the additives." "The bottom line is a lot of the animals got better just on the diet alone." This last quote is form Dr. Richard Pitcairn who has written a marvelous book on natural heath for dogs and cats - he is referring to home- made pet food being much superior to the commercial varieties.

So just what is your pet eating? How about the protein in pet food? If he label says "meat by-products", this can mean tissues from diseased animals, connective tissues, leather meal, fecal waste from poultry and other animals, horse and cattle hair, in addition to the lungs, spleen, kidneys, brain, liver, stomach and intestines the meat industry claims it includes. And what of "meat meal". Aha! This is true mystery meat, as it consists of rendered meat from all sources, including dead cats and dogs. Your pet is able to utilize only about 75% of the protein in meat meal on a dry weight basis, but this is made even less digestible by the high cooking temperatures used.

Other ingredients you may not be aware of are the fillers which can include mouldy grains, and rancid fats, heavy metal contaminants, sweeteners, artificial colours, flavours and preservatives, the latter including the potentially dangerous BHA, BHT, ethoxyquin and sodium nitrate.

Vitamins and minerals are usually not listed in terms of amounts on pet food packaging - you don't know how much the product contains. Heat processing, particularly in the presence of oxygen, and interactions with other ingredients during shelf storage can destroy certain vitamins such as A, E, and B1. The minerals used in most pet foods lack the complex organic structures found in natural foods and are not easily utilized by the animal.

So what can you do? The best alternatives is to prepare the food yourself from fresh, raw ingredients, including a high quality source of protein, and add appropriate vitamin and mineral supplementation according to the species, age and special needs of your pet. Or you can feed a very high quality brand of pet food (there are 1 or 2 out there), adding fresh vegetables and some supplements to boost nutritional

### Join the Debate

The CBC's advertising-regulatory body has refused to air a TV spot which criticizes B.C. forestry practices.

John Davis, Ottawa chief of CBC Advertising Standards, says the Media Foundation's Talking Rainforest ad contravenes page two of the CBC Advertising Standards Codebook, which states: "CBC does not permit advertisers to buy time for the broadcast of controversial material." The codebook goes on to say: "The principle of this policy is that the airwaves must not come under the control of any individual or group who because of wealth, special position, etc., might be better able to influence listener or viewer attitudes on a contentios issue."

"The CBC is violating the spirit of its own rules when it rejects our ads," says Kalle Lasn,

tion created its first ad to the B.C. Council of Forever campaign. too, was rejected by

the CBC as "too controversial". The CBC decision provoked a public outcry, which finally forced the broadcaster to pull the forest-industry ads off the air. However, the CBC continued running forestry giant MacMillan-Blodel's image-boosting commercials. The clay-animation Talking Rainforest ad was designed as an answer to the Mac-Blo campaign. Its premiere broadcast in British Columbia on BCTV's late news, was August 6, 1990.

The Media Foundation, which produces media-literacy magazine ADBUSTERS QUARTERLY in addition to its public-service ads, has repeatedly found its efforts to get messages onscreen stymied - not only by the CBC, but by the Telecaster Committee of Canada, ad standards watchdog for CTV and other private Canadian broadcasters.

"There is no logic in the way Canadian advertising standards are being applied," says Lasn.
"For example, the CBC ran our Tubehead campaign against TV addiction; calling it a non-controversial 'motherhood' issue, while the Telecaster Committee has so far refused the air those ads; now the CBC rejects our Rainforest campaign, while Telecasters says it's fine.

"The 'controversial' clause of the CBC's ad-standards codebook was written 29 years ago," says Lasn. "The time has come to allow a free marketplace of TV spots to flourish. Every Canadian should have the right to walk into a TV station and buy 30 seconds of airtime. Why should TV broadcasters decide what is controversial and what is not in our society?"



# Focus on Women

On July 3rd, at 12:54 am, I participated in a miracle. I gave birth 8lb, 13 oz. 22 inches long. Skin like a veritable peach. A head of silky black hair Blue eyes and the most incredible articulate fingers ... with fingernails that already needed trimming. A perfect stranger, also the calmest person present. My first child at 37 year of age ... and probably my last.

This baby is nothing short of a miracle. I thought that I had lost my fertility many years ago, as another victim of the patriarchy's war against women. I had a close encounter of the worst kind with an intrauterine device known as a Dalkon Shield, the manufacturers of which (A.H. Robins) now face a multi-million dollar lawsuit ... this same little device killed and crippled women, travelled through the walls of wombs, rendered many infertile. I got off easy with a terrible pelvic infection and what I thought was irreversible damage. When the Dalkon shield came on the market it was possible for a manufacturer to unbend a paper clip, call it something catchy ... and market it as an IUD, that's how loose regulations have been when it comes to women's bodies and women's lives. Thalidomide and D.E.S. are two other horrific examples of the inattention paid to the possible consequences, and ultimately to the lack of research and governmental control.

Pregnancy and childbirth are the sort of circumstances when women are often confronted with the patriarchy at it's most implacable ... and when women are the most vulnerable. From the moment it was determined that I was pregnant, I felt like a subtle battle began.

Any women over 35 and pregnant for the first time is considered to be an elderly primapera and immediately classified as a high risk pregnancy. The first request the Doctor made was for me to undergo amniocentesis, a procedure where a rather large needle is inserted into the uterus and a quantity of amniotic fluid is drawn off, which is then tested for chromosomal abnormalities, which would be early indicators of Down's Syndrome and Spina Bifeda, etc. Amniocentesis is also used to determine the sex of the fetus, and is increasingly used as a method of sex selection, by aborting the unwanted sex. The procedure is not without risk. In the first place, the prospect of having a six inch needle inserted into my belly, the risk of a miscarriage, in order to possibly have to face the decision to abort if the child should be "defective" seemed rather bleak. I declined. I was heartened considerably by an article which literally exploded the myth of maternal age and high risk pregnancy. This article detailed some 120 scientific studies done over the past 50 years to correlate advanced maternal age and high risk pregnancy. Less than 10% of these studies were without methodological fault (in other words, they were somehow sexist) and therefore able to make direct connections between maternal age and fetal abnormalities. The medical profession and the scientific community are not impervious to prevalent social attitudes and hence patriarchal bias. For many years the underlying social belief has been that women's main function in life was child-bearing, and so any scientific evidence which would confirm that the optimum condition for women to bear children as young adults would be supported. For a women to have babies (and lots of them) would naturally preclude advanced education, careers other than homemaking and women's participation in the broader arena of social interaction. Interestingly enough, 70% of all Down's Syndrome babies are born to women under 35.

Another prenatal diagnostic technique routinely proscribed (which I begrudgingly underwent twice) is ultrasound. I see this technology as overused and unfortunately not as benign as it may appear. Long term studies are now beginning to show that some children exposed to ultrasound in utero have a much higher percentage of learning disabilities such as dyslexia. Laboratory animals exposed to high levels of ultrasound in utera show a number of negative effects, many having to do with neural development. Ultra sound is the only prenatal diagnostic technique in which informed consent is not required. At the entrance to the ultrasound lab there was a small sign in which the provincial government hastens to assure me that there is absolutely no risk involved. Small comfort considering governmental track records when it comes to the treatment of pregnant women. Women have been having babies for thousands of years without ultrasound, without amniocentesis, without fetal monitoring and all the other gadgetry the medical profession is so fond of. It seems that we, as a society are unwilling to trust our bodies ... to trust the evolutionary process the thousands of birth that have resulted in each one of us being here ... and the reality that the body has it's own innate wisdom, vastly superior to that of our rational minds. When I look at our perfect, precious child, I am overcome with the absolute and utter miracle of existence. There is no way I could have constructed a tiny fingernail, let alone a complete human being. This lack of trust creates a climate of fear and insecurity. A perfect opportunity for the "experts" in white coats with all the "knowledge" to establish themselves as the one's in control of the dangerous and untrustworthy process of birth. The stories that one hear's and the general attitude of our culture towards birth tends to make one feel that childbirth is excruciatingly painful, messy, undignified and inconvenient, dangerous and downright unpleasant. The tales of unending hours of agonizing labor, drugs, forceps and knives at the ready to not only lend themselves to states of calm and joyous expectancy. Right from the beginning of my pregnancy I felt that the medical profession viewed pregnancy and birth as a pathological process, as if it were some kind of disease.

Calm, joyous expectancy is the optimum state for a pregnant woman, and her unborn child. Constant anxiety and stress are proven to be the stimulus for the release of catecholomines and other substances which can actually inhabit fetal development, particularly neural growth. In an excellent book entitles "The Secret Life of the Unborn Child" Thomas Verney details the work being done to correlate the emotional bond between a mother and her unborn baby. The discoveries being made of the incredible process of fetal growth reenforce a sense of wonder at the incredible complexity, delicacy and divine intelligence inherent in the creation of each human being - and the need for our society to treat pregnancy, childbirth and the newborn with the same sensitivity, intelligence and respect. The negligence with which the subject of diet and nutrition is treated by the medical profession, particularly in regard to pregnancy is appalling. If human life were truly sacred, a pregnant women and a growing child would never ever want for food on this planet.

As the time of birth drew nearer, I became increasingly aware of the next challenge posed by the status quo that we would have to face. Penticton Regional Hospital has the highest rate of cesarean births in B.C. at 30%. Canada has the second highest Cesarean rate in the world. The rationale offered by the medical profession in this community is that the Penticton hospital receives all the pregnancies with complications from the South Okanagan district ... Summerland, Oliver, Osoyoos, etc. The main contributing factor for cesarean births at PRH is cephalopelvic disproportion, or babies supposedly to big to be born vaginally. I have problems believing that one women in every three has too small a pelvis to give birth. It would seem that there are a number of factors which contribute to the rate of cesarean births. Some of it has to do with the women themselves ... and our general lack of personal

empowerment when it comes to dealing with the medial profession. A good example of this for me was the hospital tour that Daryl and I went on as part of our pre-natal classes. There were ten other pregnant couples present ... and not one person asked a single question the whole time we were there. Not one Why? How come? What s this for? Except for our continual queries. I found such submission to the hospital procedures alarming to say the least.

One of the wisest preparations we made for our child's birth was the formulation of a written birth plan, a detailed list of preferences for labor and delivery which we discussed with our doctor before hand, and brought to the hospital with us. Everything was detailed, including our desire for a natural childbirth, severely limited medical intervention, florescent lights dimmed, and the opportunity for immediate and uninterrupted bonding with the baby following birth. The hospital staff complied virtually to the letter. The birth was uncomplicated, relatively serene and joyous. It was also very intense, hard work (hence the term labor) and not without some discomforts - but pain of a unique and miraculous nature. As a result we now have a bright, calm, healthy happy baby who hardly ever cries, who has smiled frequently and rapturously from the second week of existence, and is generally a joy to all. Often the miracle of birth and the power of bonding is lost in the desire for efficiency and hospital routine. It is important to remember that the hospital is there to serve us, and not the other way around.

I had other minor struggles. After about six months, I never did fit the normal charts for weight, I gained over 40 lbs. And the Doctor was more concerned about how I was going to lose the weight after the birth than the fact that I was more concerned with producing a well nourished infant. I was quite an anomole.. being a vegetarian, swimming a continuous mile three to four times a week until two weeks before I delivered, experiencing no swelling, no toxemia, very little nausea, no strange cravings. Once again, the "normal" charts seemed more important than my own glowing presence in the Doctor's office.

I often wished for a community of support, other likeminded women who felt empowered and in possession of their bodies throughout pregnancy and birthing. I wept after reading about a birthing centre in a community in France (population 10,000) where women got to singing classes and prenatal yoga classes with their partners and children throughout pregnancy, and when in labor stroll through the beautiful gardens and grounds, and give birth in a place that they have come to know and love, surrounded by people that they trust, and in the presence of midwifes, women far more extensively trained in the intricacies of pregnancy and birth than the average North American physician. One day, perhaps our children will know this kind of caring and respect when they bring their children into this world.

I am reminded of a delightful anecdote I have heard about Mahatma Gandhi. Once when Gandhi came to visit England, on disembarking from his train, he was mobbed by reporters. "Tell us, Mr. Ganhdi," demanded one "How do you like modern civilization?". "That would be nice.", he replied.

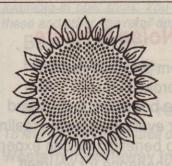

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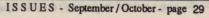
